- Will AI replace humans as the dominant species on Earth?

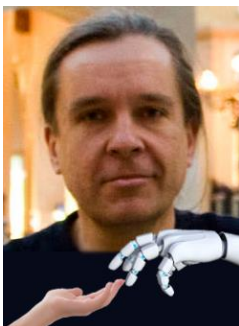
Join us January 9 for a lively open discussion, starting with an informal debate between two experts:

It is perfectly possible to create AI that doesn't care about people, in which case it may well destroy everything we value. On the other hand, if we are careful in how we build it, AI could deliver a world that is vastly better than the present day. The choice of consequence—of heaven or extermination—may well be made within our lifetimes.
